Mott Award Honors Top Grad Students

Twenty-one students have been named to receive the 2007 Gerald O. Mott Meritorious Graduate Student Award in Crop Science. This annual award recognizes top-notch graduate students pursuing advanced degrees in crop science disciplines. Departments select students based on academic achievements, research and teaching contributions, leadership accomplishments, service activities, and personal qualifications. Recipients of the award, which is offered by CSSA, receive a certificate and the opportunity to apply for the Gerald O. Mott Scholarship. The award is named after the first CSSA President, Gerald O. Mott, who trained 75 graduate students during his 45-year career at Purdue University and the University of Florida.



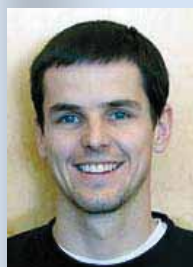
